1.1 Call to Order

Mayor Pro Tempore Jim Potts called the regular meeting of the San Jacinto City Council and Redevelopment Agency to order at 7:05 p.m.

1.3 Invocation

Pastor Gene Lavell, Mountain View Baptist Church gave the invocation.

1.4 Pledge of Allegiance

Council Member Mansperger led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1.5 Special Presentations

1.5.1 Recognition of City Employees that assisted injured citizen

Public Works Director Mike Emberton spoke about the man on the bicycle that was overwhelmed by heat exhaustion and how three Public Works employees assisted him. Public Works Director Emberton asked Dave Carrico, Frank Zalidvar, and Jose Vilchis to come forward.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts read the certificates and congratulated them for their outstanding actions. He said these men are heroes, people who take the time to stop and help because most people just drive by. He said he and the entire council are proud of them.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS:**2.0 Public Comments**

Karri Jones, Patsy's Country Kitchen, 1221 N. State St., San Jacinto – said she is upset because she was told before signing the lease there was a program for tenant improvements. She said many of her customers at her Banning location urged her to open in San Jacinto. Ms Jones commented that she has had sixty to eighty people asking for jobs and she would like to get the restaurant up and running. She added that San Jacinto is losing out because of jobs and revenue. Ms Jones said originally she had been told there were funds and now she is being advised that there are none. She asked why the program could not be implemented.

Russ Utz, San Jacinto Chamber of Commerce, 490 S. Sheriff, San Jacinto – said the San Jacinto Chamber of Commerce is celebrating their second annual Birthday Bash on September 25, 2010 at the Portofino Ranch. The tickets are twenty-five dollars per person and forty dollars per couple. He added there is additional information at the chamber offices.

James Pangrazzi, 408 S. Kirby St., San Jacinto, CA – said at the last meeting a woman from the neighborhood named Elizabeth spoke and brought up the sidewalks and the visibility of curbs. He said since then the curbs have been painted white and that should help. He said the same problem exists on Cottonwood and urged Public Works to look at that street as well. Mr. Pangrazzi commented that Elizabeth stated that the volume of traffic on Kirby is not sufficient to warrant a traffic signal however the Traffic Survey suggests that it is. He added that the money is there and there is enough space so it should be built.

Don Leslie, 1793 Messina Dr., San Jacinto – said approximately eight months ago he contacted the Public Works Director and the Police Chief regarding Van Fleet and Commonwealth. He said there is absolutely no place to park because of the red curbs. He asked if there could be a sign posted that allowed parking on Saturday and Sunday when school is not in session. He added that he is forced to park two blocks away when he wants to visit his niece.

4.2 Urgency Ordinance 10-09 / Urgency Ordinance Establishing Time, Place and Manner Restrictions on Registered Sex Offenders on Halloween / **Approve** / City Attorney

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts explained that because this is an Urgency Ordinance a 4/5th vote would be required to pass it. He said since there are only three council members present it would need to be continued to the next meeting of October 7, 2010. He added that because there are people in attendance who came to speak on the issue it would be fair to allow them to make their comments if they wished.

Fred Rodriguez, 1093 Commonwealth Ave., San Jacinto – said he was here because he wanted his comments to be on the record. He said in his opinion, anyone who hurts a child is the lowest form of human being and calling them animals is not good enough. He said that in reading the Ordinance he has concerns about how it will be enforced and liabilities. He said that the City Attorney mentions legal ramifications regarding 1st amendment rights. He added that he does not want to see a child predator get rich because his rights are violated. He suggested that alternatives be looked at such as making the parents aware by passing out flyers pointing out where the sex offenders live. He urged the council to consider the ramifications.

Council Member Mansperger said he shares the same concerns and has two daughters of his own. He said he looks at the Megans Law website and chooses areas where there are no offenders living to take his daughter on Halloween. He said his concern is that this Ordinance might give parents and children a false sense of security. He said he can't support this Ordinance right now and that Mr. Rodriguez is correct, it could potentially cost the city money.

Frank Gorman, Valley Watch, 800 E. Florida Ave., Hemet – said he does not want the city to be sued and lose money in a lawsuit. He said the City of Orange has enacted this Ordinance and to date has had no legal issues that he is aware of. He said in today's world, you see kids running everywhere that don't have parents watching them. He said it would be nice if all parents took their children and walked with them. Mr. Gorman said this Ordinance would also protect the sex offender, as he would not be able to interact with kids and go back to jail. He said everyone on the Megans Law website are hard core sex offenders. He said as a citizen that wants to protect kids, it is imperative that we do whatever we can. He added if one kid is saved from being molested it is worth it. Mr. Gorman said Valley Watch is working to educate people about Megans Law. He added that Supervisor Stone has been supportive and he is bringing it before the Board of Supervisors.

Council Member Mansperger asked if the county enacted the Ordinance would it protect the city.

Deputy City Attorney Shane said it would only apply to areas in the county not San Jacinto City limits.

Mr. Gorman said Supervisor Stone asked for a copy of San Jacinto Ordinance if it is approved. He said if the city does not elect to adopt this, could they make sure a notice is sent to all registered sex offenders and tell them that the City discourages them from attracting kids to their residence with decorations. He added that there are eighty-seven registered offenders in San Jacinto.

Council Member Ayres asked Mr. Gorman if he has discussed this subject with Valley Wide.

Mr. Gorman responded that he has not discussed the Ordinance with Valley Wide; however he has discussed RAD Kids with them. He said Valley Watch is in process of training twenty instructors to teach kids how to get away from predators and teach parents how to recognize these dangers.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked Deputy City Attorney Shane if Public Hearing should be opened.

Deputy City Attorney Shane responded that this was not a noticed item so they were free to discuss it without opening Public Hearing.

Council Member Ayres said he was taken aback by Supervisor Stone wanting to do this in the county. He said there are about two million offenders in the county and it would be hard to enforce. Council Member Ayres said he feels like the City of San Jacinto is being set up as a social guinea pig, being asked to commit to an Urgency Ordinance at such a late date. He said he does agree that this could place the city at liability and that is not right. He commented that Mr. Gorman's program, Valley Watch is very good and is a great benefit to children and parents. He stated that some of the responsibility should fall on the parents. He said he would like to see more from the City Attorney's office on this item.

Mr. Gorman said he does not think the Ordinance could be policed at this time; it is something that will take a while. He said he just heard about this Ordinance and about the City of Orange adopting it. He said he does not want children to go to registered offenders residences.

Council Member Mansperger said it is his understanding that if a sex offender is conversing with a child, he is guilty of violating probation. He suggested that Valley Watch send a letter to the offenders to let them know they will be watched. He stressed again that the Ordinance would give a false sense of security to parents and children.

Deputy City Attorney Shane said it is possible that once probation is completed they may not be in violation.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts suggested that they might be discussing this item in depth too much because all five council members are not here. He said it might be best to continue this with a full council.

Council Member Mansperger said if the offenders are not following the law they would not care about this Ordinance.

Mr. Gorman said this is one more tool for parents to use to protect the kids. He said Valley Watch would send flyers to every offender in the city.

Council Member Ayres asked if Mr. Gorman has gone in front of the Hemet City Council to speak.

Mr. Gorman said he is meeting with the Hemet City Manager next week. He said he does not want to see the City of San Jacinto be liable and if this is not feasible, then vote no on it and maybe it can be looked at next year with different scenarios.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts said he would ask the City Attorney to look at this in more depth for the next meeting.

Council Member Ayres suggested that the Public Safety Subcommittee meet about this and review the item prior to coming back to the council.

5. STAFF REPORTS

5.1 Western Riverside Energy Leader Partnership Program Update / Receive and File / Barbara Spoonhour, Program Manager, WRCOG

Ms Barbara Spoonhour, Program Manager for WRCOG presented the staff report and gave a presentation. The full presentation is on file with the City Clerk. She said that the agreement between WRCOG and Southern California Edison provides rebates for residential customers in eleven jurisdictions. She said the direct install program is offered free by Edison. She said the participants are the small mom and pop locations and there are 504 eligible properties in the City of San Jacinto. She added that the audit will take about five to ten minutes and can provide many energy saving tools for businesses. Ms

Spoonhour said she is here marketing the program and to get the city's support and provided materials to the council members.

Council Member Mansperger asked what the catch was.

Ms Spoonhour said there really is no catch, the utility rate payers pay for this, it is a gift back from the Public Utility Commission, through Edison.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked why no franchises are included in this program.

Ms Spoonhour said this is just for the mom and pop stores.

Alonzo Ledezma, 168 Solana, San Jacinto – said approximately one year ago this program was issued but he missed it. He said that everyone else in his building has this and he has been waiting for a bill, but has never received one. He added that this is a great program.

Ray Hicks, Southern California Edison said the reason the franchises and larger businesses are not eligible is that they get assistance through other programs.

Council Member Mansperger asked how soon this would take effect and how long the process would be.

Ms Spoonhour said this program would start on October 1, 2010 and run through the month. She added that she hopes the City of San Jacinto will endorse this with a letter from the mayor.

5.2 EMWD Request to Modify Conditions for Eagle Road Closure, Idyllwild Drive Closure / **Discuss** / Interim City Manager, City Engineer

City Manager Tim Hults said this is a request to amend the encroachment permit that authorized the road closure of Eagle Road and partial road closure Idyllwild Drive. The closure of Eagle Road was to occur during the summer months and the partial closure of Idyllwild Drive during the same time frame. He said this project started in March of this year, and when the City Engineers office noticed that the project would not be completed during the time frame the contractor would need an amendment to seek additional time. He stated that Eagle would be closed between Idyllwild and Wimbledon for a short time and that traffic be diverted down Wimbledon to Baker. He added that Idyllwild would be closed during the holiday season when school is not in session. City Manager Hults commented that the council approved the original road closure and staff is asking for direction.

Council Member Mansperger asked if the portion along Eagle would be done during the holidays also.

City Manager Hults said that Idyllwild would be done during the holiday season and Eagle road closure would be fairly short.

Council Member Mansperger asked how long that would be.

City Manager Hults responded that it should take approximately thirteen days.

Council Member Mansperger asked if there was a way to schedule the work after school hours. He said Idyllwild cannot be done during school hours.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts commented that everyone is a little disappointed that this project did not go as expected. He said there are times when something comes up, but it never seems to get done. He said it is the council that takes the heat for the issues, not the contractor or EMWD.

James Wyatt, Field Engineer for EMWD, 2707 E. Devonshire, Hemet – said he is disappointed that the job has not been completed. He said that he called the vice president when the city called EMWD and he saw that the project was not going to get done. He added that the general superintendent that started this project is very experienced but unfortunately he is out on sick leave. The contractor assigned a junior staff member to complete the project and it did not work.

Council Member Mansperger asked if it was thirteen days for sure.

Mr. Wyatt said it is twelve days.

Council Member Mansperger asked if that gives the contractor a little leeway for rain or other problems that arise. He said one of his issues with the contractor is the little things that irritate people, like a backhoe driving 10 mph down the street and doesn't pull over. He said it's a nothing thing, but it gets people upset especially when it is school time and you have to get your child there. He commented that the work that was done for the school district during the Christmas holidays was great. He said he gets called whenever streets are closed but said he believes the council has to support this but EMWD's phone number should be posted for people to call if they have issues.

Council Member Ayres said he thinks EMWD has done a terrible job; Lyon Ave was torn up two times to put a water line in after the city had repaved it. He said the shopping center on the corner of Ramona Expressway and State Street was held up because the contractor did

not complete the work on time. He commented that EMWD is asking the council to close Eagle for twelve days and asked if EMWD was willing to pay damages to the city if the project is not completed within that time frame. He said this project was supposed to be completed in the summer and now they are asking to work during the Christmas break. He stated what happens if it is not done by the end of Christmas break, there are seven thousand kids that go to school in that vicinity that will be and have been impacted because EMWD's contractor can't get the work done. He said he does not support this as it is, but would support option number two with modifications. He said this is the historical pattern with EMWD and their contractors. He stated that he was sorry that a junior guy was put in charge but the council can't dictate that, however they can dictate whether they move forward with this amendment. He said Idyllwild was just repaved and now it will be torn up and have to be repaved again. He said there is no guarantee that the work will get done within the twelve days. He commented that this item needs to be re-addressed and modified in the interest of the city and the students. He added that the city has heard the excuses from EMWD for eleven and a half years.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked if notices were sent to all the neighbors.

City Manager Hults said notices were sent to residents in the areas that would be affected. He said the notices were sent on September 8, 2010 and the residents were noticed about this meeting as well. He said the notices had Mr. Wyatt's information on them.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked Dave Ross from the Engineering department what kind of complaints has the department been receiving about the contractor and the actual work. He asked if the contractor seemed professional.

Dave Ross, City Engineering Department said yes and no. He said because of the unknown underground utilities it was somewhat of a slower pace.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts commented that the contractor's calculations on the time it would take to complete the project were incorrect.

Mr. Ross said yes that was basically the issue.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked if this contractor had done work for the city before and if Mr. Ross had worked with them before.

Mr. Ross said he has worked with the contractor before but not in San Jacinto.

Council Member Ayres asked if it was twelve calendar days or school days.

Mr. Ross said it was stated as calendar days.

Council Member Ayres asked if most contracts have a start date and a finish date.

Mr. Ross responded that is the normal agreement.

Council Member Mansperger said that the contractor had the window for summer break to do this project and asked why didn't they do that section and then move on.

Mr. Wyatt said that is the way he would have scheduled it but this is where the inexperience comes into play.

Council Member Mansperger said if these twelve days were granted and they did not finish in time the contractor should be penalized.

Mr. Wyatt said the council can condition the permit and EMWD can pass it on to the contractor.

Council Member Ayres said that was done the first time and now it's back again, and what is to say it won't come back a third time. He said that he would only support number two.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked Deputy City Attorney Shane what modifications could be put on the amendment that would motivate the contractor.

Deputy City Attorney Shane said if the city is damaged by the delay a fee could be assessed as long as it is not punitive.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts said he is open to a motion but he agrees that number one is not acceptable.

Council Member Mansperger asked for confirmation that the agreement would be for Eagle and Idyllwild both.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts commented that a lot of the residents on Eagle will be upset because a lot of traffic will be shifted down there. He asked if there was anyone in the audience who would be affected by this project that would like to speak.

Jim Pangrazzi, 408 S. Kirby St., San Jacinto – said that the council should take into account how many people use the library at the high school. Mr. Pangrazzi said Dianna at the San Jacinto Library said eight

to nine hundred people attend the Library daily and attendance might increase if the Hemet Library closes. He added that this should be done during the summer; this is not a good time.

City Manager Hults said he asked Dave Ross, in his experience what the Engineering Department has done with similar types of encroachment permits such as this. He said a \$1,250 per day fee could be assessed for extension of the encroachment permit.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts asked the Deputy City Attorney if that was a reasonable amount.

Deputy City Attorney Shane commented that appears to be reasonable if there is any impact on the city.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts said he believes all three council members agree that number one is out of the question. He said if they went with number 2 there would be a clause that would cover damages.

Deputy City Attorney Shane said it would not be for damages it would be the cost of the permit with the daily amount added for extensions.

Council Member Mansperger said the issue is with the school and the times that the students are arriving and leaving.

Council Member Ayres said he has reviewed the times when school's are out and there are many cars up and down Idyllwild. He said this should have been done in the summertime. He asked Deputy City Attorney Shane if the council can arbitrarily use the amount suggested right now.

Deputy City Attorney Shane said it has been used in the past so they could use Option two and impose a fine of \$1,250 per day after the 12th day.

Peter Odenrans, EMWD – said he realizes the frustration and sometimes problems do have issues, but one thing that has been overlooked. He said the project that is disrupting the street is part of the recycled water program and it will benefit San Jacinto citizens.

Council Member Ayres said he understands that and it was understood a year ago when the project started. He said the city is being impacted again and again and the contractor is still not done.

Council Member Mansperger said it is true that the city is being impacted again and the council does not want them to have to come back again. He said the majority of the recycled water is going towards ponds and probably benefits a farmer more than anyone else.

M/S/C (Ayres/Mansperger) to approve the amendment to modify the encroachment permit with the stipulation \$1,250 per day past the 12th day. Motion carried 3/0.

5.3 Planning Commission terms set to expire in October 2010 / Discuss / City Clerk

City Clerk Rick Miller presented the staff report saying that the Planning Commission has two Commissioners whose terms expire in October of 2010. He said they are Chairman Steve Warneke and Commissioner Larry Pellerin. He stated that after reviewing the Municipal Code and the Planning Commission By-laws and neither specify that a Planning Commission seat is automatically vacated when a term expires. Because there is an election coming in November up staff is looking for direction. He asked if the council would like to postpone searching for new Planning Commissioners or extend their terms until after the election.

Mayor Pro Tempore Potts said there will definitely be two new Council Members in November. He said the two Planning Commissioners have done a great job and it is his hope they will be around.

Council Member Mansperger said he agreed that Steve Warneke and Larry Pellerin were outstanding.

M/S/C (Ayres/Mansperger) to approve that Chairman Steve Warneke and Commissioner Larry Pellerin stay in place until the new council is seated. Motion carried 3/0.

6. MAYOR / COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS / DISCUSSIONS

Council Member Ayres apologized for not being at the last council meeting. He said his son played his first football game for San Jacinto High School. He said they lost but it was a great game.

Council Member Mansperger said he had the honor of attending the Chamber of Commerce mixer at Hanger 1 at Ryan Field in Hemet. He said it was well attended and San Jacinto is doing well.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

2.0 Public Comments

James Pangrazzi, 408 S. Kirby St., San Jacinto, CA – spoke about the signal light at Cottonwood Ave. and Kirby St. He said he presented the traffic survey to the Police Department and it was also given to the council. He said this was a valid survey. He said last Thursday he was called and notified that a Speed Survey and a Traffic Survey was being done. He said the Speed Survey took place between nine and eleven a.m. according to the man taking it and the Traffic Survey was taking place between five p.m. Wednesday and five p.m. Thursday. He said that he spoke to the person doing the survey and advised him what should be included such as a CBC 627 that states within ¼ miles if there are thirteen dwellings there should be an allowance. He said the distance between Warwick and Roanoak is exactly ¼ mile as measured by his Magellan GPS. He said he wants to make sure this is not forgotten because in the past he has been given excuses that there are not enough accidents, motorists, bicyclists to warrant a signal and things are changing. He said that mothers from the Megan Cope Elementary School have told him that there have been altercations because of parking. He said some of the mothers are parking in CVS and some are letting their kids walk. He added that after the attempted assault the numbers of kids walking has dropped. Mr. Pangrazzi said that he was told by City Manager Tim Hults that the reason nothing has been done is because City Engineer Habib Motlagh wanted to complete his own Traffic Analysis and some time has passed and the Analysis has not been done. He said that City Engineer Motlagh called him for the first time and said that this analysis would be an update. Mr. Pangrazzi said he does not see this

as an update, he feels it is an attempt to change the present Traffic Survey and he wishes they would not do that.

John Shogren, 110 S. Kirby, San Jacinto – said he understands there was a Traffic Survey done and he lives on the corner of Kirby and Cottonwood. Mr. Shogren said he believes the survey will show that the traffic does not warrant a Traffic Signal at the corner of Cottonwood and Kirby. He said he feels that the money would be better spent elsewhere at another location that would warrant the signal. He added that the four way stop is working very well.

Randy Williams, former city staff member – said he is a big fan of the City of San Jacinto. He said he wanted to take this opportunity to speak about some of the memorable experiences of San Jacinto, as some council members are retiring and new members will come in after the election. He read from a letter that is on file with the City Clerk's office. He spoke of various past council members and employees and the accomplishments the City has had. Mr. Williams mentioned the time capsule that was encased in concrete at Hoffman Park and said when the time comes and the capsule is unsealed the items will not be tarnished, nor the period they represent.

David Kirkendall, 1993 Hemingway, San Jacinto – requested assistance from the city for a business plan that was submitted to the Planning Department two weeks ago. He requested an answer in writing whether his application will be approved or disapproved. He said if it is disapproved he would like to know why.

Paula Lecitra, 495 Sheriff, San Jacinto – said she is the newly elected President of the San Jacinto Chamber of Commerce. She thanked City Manager Tim Hults for dropping the green flag at the Speedway. Ms Lecitra thanked Economic Development Manager Sharon Paisley for being the first guest speaker at the Chamber's Education Luncheon. She said City Manager Tim Hults would be the speaker at the next luncheon on October 26th. She announced that the next blender would be held at Sunwest Village on October 13th at 5:30 p.m. and invited everyone to attend. Ms Lecitra thanked Mayor Stubblefield, City Council Member Mansperger, City Council Member Potts, City Manager Hults, and City Attorney Ballinger for their continued support of the Chamber. She said they are continuing to grow and will continue to make their presence known in San Jacinto.

Howard Tounget, Hemet – spoke about the Special Events Permit for a function on Mr. Minor's property on Friday evening in support of Bill Emerson. He said the event was just approved today for tomorrow's event and the cost was twenty-five dollars. He said that he doubted if the twenty-five dollar fee would be enough to pay all the direct costs involved. He commented that there were space for seven signatures but only two had been signed, Building and Planning. He said that Police Chief Sue Trevino submitted a letter of approval with her recommendations. He asked who

would monitor the noise and parking issues after hours. He asked the council to look into his questions.

2.1 City Manager's Report of previous month's public comments

City Manager Hults said there were six speakers at the September 2nd and 16th Council Meetings that required follow-up. He said one was Dave Kirkendall who had Code Enforcement issues related to property maintenance in his neighborhood. Public Works Director Mike Emberton spoke with Mr. Kirkendall and the issues were discussed. Another speaker was James Pangrazzi who spoke at both the Sept. 2nd and 16th meetings regarding the signal and city DIFF program. He said City Engineer Motlagh has spoken with Mr. Pangrazzi. Elizabeth Shogren spoke at the September 2nd meeting and thanked the council for the sidewalks on Kirby and indicated that the curbs needed to be painted, and staff did paint them. City Manager Hults said that Kerry Jones spoke at the Sept 16th meeting about the restaurant she intends to open in San Jacinto. She asked for clarification on assistance she had expected from the city. He said he spoke with Ms. Jones and is working with City Attorney Ballinger and Economic Development Manager Paisley to put together a program for Ms. Jones. Don Leslie spoke about red curbs at Van Fleet and Commonwealth and staff did do some curb painting south of Commonwealth.


