



Water Distribution Operator I

Salary Depending on Qualifications is \$20.77 to \$24.93 hourly.

Applications will be accepted until Wednesday, June 27, 2018.

The City of San Jacinto is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Water Distribution Operator I to perform semi-skilled duties involved in the maintenance, repair, installation, and construction of the water and wastewater distribution systems and facilities. This is the entry level position in the class series performing work in the maintenance, and repair of City water/sewer lines; troubleshooting and identifying water/sewer flow problems, initiating corrective actions, and preparing work orders and discrepancy reports. To perform maintenance, and repair incumbents use and operate equipment such as: jackhammers, compactors, pipe cutting equipment; flow meters, front-end loaders, tractors, valve truck, meter reading cart, and non-commercial truck with or without a trailer. Other typical tasks performed are installing blacktop and concrete to streets and sidewalks when installations and utility repairs are complete; reading water meters; operating SCADA Systems, responding to emergency situations as necessary; respond to citizen complaints tactfully and promptly; and to perform related duties as assigned.

The Ideal Candidate will:

- Possess skill in the use and purpose of general construction and maintenance tools and equipment.
- Perform task using safe work practices.
- Perform duties in the construction, maintenance and repair of streets and water/sewer systems.
- Follow and understand oral and written instructions.
- Act effectively under stressful or emergency situations.
- Possess skill in operating a wide variety of equipment and tools used in water distribution systems maintenance and repair in a safe and effective manner.
- Operate a motor vehicle using safe driving principles and practices; and maintain a clean driving record.
- Perform heavy manual labor for extended periods of time in all types of weather and have the ability to lift up to 90 pounds.
- Understand and learn the operational characteristics of specialized water distribution system maintenance equipment.
- Materials, methods, practices, and equipment used in water distribution system maintenance and repair.
- Perform work utilizing the proper occupational hazards and standard safety precautions necessary in maintenance and repair work.
- Possess the ability to read, interpret, and apply technical information from manuals, drawings, specifications, layouts, blueprints, and schematics.
- Perform accurate mathematical calculations.
- Communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing.
- Establish, maintain, and foster positive and harmonious working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Minimum Qualifications:

A typical way of obtaining the required qualifications is to possess the equivalent of:

Experience - One (1) year of experience in performing general construction or mechanical equipment maintenance work involving the use of hand and power tools and the operation of non-commercial trucks.

Licenses and Certificates – Possession of a valid Class “C” California Driver’s License
Employee must possess and maintain within one year of employment a Class “B” Commercial California Drivers’ License with Tanker Endorsement.

Possession of or obtain within 18 months of employment: CDPH Water Distribution Operator Grade D1 Certificate issued by the State of California.

Education - High school diploma or equivalent.

Compensation and Benefits:

The starting salary will be commensurate with the experience, qualifications and skills of the successful candidate and within the range of \$20.77 to \$24.93 hourly.

The City of San Jacinto also offers a competitive benefits package, including California Public Employees Retirement System pension, fully-paid medical, dental, and vision for both the employee and qualified dependents, a generous health reimbursement account, life insurance, disability, AD&D, tuition reimbursement and continuing education.

About the City of San Jacinto:

Founded in 1870, and incorporated on April 9, 1888, San Jacinto is one of the County's oldest communities with roots that stretch back to the earliest days of California. The current population is just under 48,000 in San Jacinto’s 26 square miles, with an average population age of 31.6 years old.

San Jacinto is experiencing a revitalization in a variety of development projects, road and drainage improvements, and is growing at its fastest pace in well over 10 years. The community is excited about the new economic development inside the City spurred by the development of the new 480,000 square foot Soboba Casino Resort, new retail establishments (Aldi Grocery, Starbucks Drive Thru, Wienerschnitzel Restaurant and Sonic Drive In, among others to come) and over 200 new homes permitted this calendar year.
