

The general meeting will be held on Monday, September 16 at 6:00 pm at the San Jacinto Museum. A program will follow the potluck dinner at 7:00 pm. The program will be presented by the Calicinto Ranch located at the east end of Main Street and Soboba Road. The Calicinto Ranch is a Ministry that serves and mentors children who have one or both parents in prison. There are 2 million children in America who are in this situation, and statistics reveal that 7 out of 10 of these children will end up in prison, following in the footsteps of their parents. Camps are offered at Calicinto Ranch in the summertime, at no cost to the children or their families. They are also invited to Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas events, and receive newsletters and birthday cards. The Ranch also hosts Leadership Camps and various opportunities for alumni campers over the age of 11 throughout the year. The goal of Calicinto Ranch is to never forget or lose touch with so-called “forgotten victims of crime”.

When you come to the meeting, bring a friend with you. This will be an interesting program of an organization located right here in San Jacinto, ministering to children of need.
