Subject: **Neighborhood Meeting on July 31, 2007**

Dear Resident:

I want to thank you for hosting a neighborhood meeting at your community’s club house on July 31. The City Council and staff greatly value your input and suggestions. The following represents the concerns and issues expressed by those in attendance and how those issues have or will be addressed by the City:

1. **Area on the north side of the Park:** The Public Works Department has been notified of the community’s concerns regarding this area and will conduct an investigation. If it is the City’s property, clean-up will commence and any weeds will be removed and overgrown vegetation pruned. Otherwise, Code Enforcement will be notified in order to initiate any private party abatement action.
2. **Bath Well standing water:** Occasionally, about once a month, the filters at the Bath Well site need to be flushed. The flushing of the filters results in small pools of shallow standing water. However, the pools of water dissipate or dry-out within 72 hours. The Public Works Department has confirmed with the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health that for any mosquito larvae to develop such pools would need to be stagnant for substantially longer than 72 hours. In any case, the Public Works Department will continually monitor to filter flushing to ensure that pools do not become stagnant or last in excess of 72 hours.
