ISC Does "The Time Warp Again"

"The Rocky Horror Show" returns to the Inland Stage with a new cast and the same flare.

"Our February/March Production of Rocky Horror was so successful - everyone had such a good time doing the show, that it seemed natural,"

said Director Jim Marbury about the reprise of the show. "Of course, we went back to the drawing board on every aspect of the production. It's like we're doing it for the first time, but with last years' experience under our belt."

This year's production builds on previous success with new energy and different thought.

"Last season's show had a smaller set, a different band, a (mostly) new cast - we've added more dancers. Plus our approach to the music is very different - it's a lot more funky, whereas last years' was more straight forward Rock and Roll," Marbury said.

On top of great material, the production includes a fabulous cast.

"We have a really strong cast this year," Marbury said.

ISC newcomer, Danny Guerrero, plays Brad Majors, and Paola Cifuentes reprises her role of Janet Weiss.

Critically acclaimed actor Travis Rhett Wilson plays Riff-Raff, and Winston Peacock, who played Riff-Raff last year, plays Frank-n-Furter.

Leia Redmond, the choreographer, returns as Magenta with newcomers Chris Murphy and Art Baum playing Rocky, the creature, and Eddie, respectively.

"We've added two phantom dancers this year, Carmina Manley and Gloria Amaya," Marbury said.

During the run of "Rocky Horror," ISC will announce their 2011-12 season and offer special subscription discounts to anyone who attends "Rocky Horror."

ISC's "The Rocky Horror Show" runs Jan. 28 through Feb. 12 at the Esplanade Art Center, 2181 W. Esplanade Ave, San Jacinto. Showtimes are 8 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays, with midnight showings on Saturday nights.

Tickets cost \$15 for general admission; \$12 for Students, Seniors, and Military; and \$7 for Student Rush tickets. Student Rush tickets can be purchased 10 minutes before the show begins, with valid student ID.
